

## Extra-Curricular Activity: “Best Anti-Bullying” Award!

<p><b>Description of educational activity:</b></p>	<p>The duration of this activity is 90 minutes. It can be implemented with pupils of 12 to 14 years old, during the school thematic week titled “<i>A different type of school!</i>”</p> <p>The activity is based on competition thus pupils work in 3-5 teams.</p> <p>Each team receives an empty paper box labeled “<i>Anti-bullying toolkit</i>”. The task is to fill the toolkit with 5 ‘tools’, namely:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. An anti-bullying motto, formulated like a four-lines strophe;</li> <li>2. An anti-bullying poster;</li> <li>3. A list of advices for a bully in order to help him/her to correct the bad behaviour;</li> <li>4. A set of school anti-bullying rules for pupils;</li> <li>5. A handmade mind map presenting: the objectives, structure and functions of a school anti-bullying committee.</li> </ol> <p>Teams will have at their disposal all necessary materials and resources (computers, internet access, coloured markers and stickers, paper sheets, etc.).</p> <p>Evaluation of the toolkits is done by the teacher based on qualitative and quantitative indicators (i.e. observance of the working time, delivery of all 5 tools, number and relevance of the advices and rules, clarity and consistency of the message transmitted through the poster and motto, efficiency of the anti-bullying committee, etc.). The team with the highest score wins.</p> <p>This activity has as main effects:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>a) Development of pupils’ creativity in generating and producing relevant anti-bullying tools and products, in designing and implementing new approaches for combating bullying;</li> <li>b) Increased awareness on the need for and efficiency of a combined anti-bullying approach, that to be based on various means and methods.</li> </ol>

<p><b>Objectives: (KSC* developed)</b></p>	<p>This activity intends to enable students to:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Select and synthesize the most suitable available information on a given topic (anti-bullying) (S)</li> <li>2. Illustrate their ideas on approaching bullying efficiently (S)</li> <li>3. Design tools for raising awareness in combating bullying (S)</li> <li>4. Create art with a purpose (anti-bullying verses) (S)</li> <li>5. Discover the values of competition (S)</li> </ol>



<b>Material:</b>	Empty paper boxes, Computers, Internet access, Printer, Flipchart, Coloured markers and stickers, Paper sheets
<b>Notes for the teacher:</b>	This activity has to be implemented only to pupils who have been taught already about bullying (definition, types, participants).
<b>Recommendations for additional activities:</b>	After the activity, pupils should use the tools from their toolkit in an anti-bullying campaign organised in their school or in another school.
