

## Extra-Curricular Activity: The Trial of a Bully!

<b>Description of educational activity:</b>	<p>This 50-minutes activity for children aged 12 to 14 can be implemented during the school thematic week titled “A different type of school!”</p> <p>Pupils watch the movie “Cyberbullying” (<a href="https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=nBVoGzwQzro">https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=nBVoGzwQzro</a>) in which Valerie is bullied.</p> <p>The teacher provides pupils with worksheets and monitors them to solve the task of identifying the participants to the bullying in the movie (<i>bully, bullied, bystanders, etc.</i>).</p> <p>S/he explains that they will play a trial for judging the movie bully and nominates one prosecuting and one defense attorney. The rest of the pupils will be members of the jury.</p> <p>The teacher gives each pupil (except the two attorneys) two feathers: one green and one red and presents the rules of the trial: the accusation attorney should express arguments against the bully, while the defense attorney will formulate arguments in favour of the bully (one argument and one attorney at a time). The members of the jury agree/disagree by raising the green, respectively the red feather, but they need to <u>explain their position</u> (why they agree/disagree). Each time they raise the feathers, the teacher picks up only one pupil who has to explain his/her position (point of view). The teacher explains to all pupils why that point of view is right or wrong.</p> <p>The teacher decides when the activity stops, because in this activity it matters the analysis and judgment process and not the result of the trial: it doesn’t matter if the bully is convicted or not, but the analysis of the bully’s behaviour is important!</p> <p>As qualitative evaluation method the teacher will use an observation grid to assess various features of the bullying analysis performed through the trial.</p> <p>The effect of this activity is the development of deep reactions in pupils’ thinking regarding: bullying, its negative results and the need for combating and stopping it.</p>

<b>Objectives: (KSC* developed)</b>	<p>This activity intends to enable students to:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Identify elements of bullying (types of bullying, bully, bullied, bystanders, etc.) (K)</li> <li>2. Develop critical thinking (S)</li> <li>3. Analyse causes and effects of bullying (S)</li> <li>4. Provide evidences to argue why bullying should be combated (S)</li> </ol>
<b>Material:</b>	Computer, Projector, Movie, Internet access, Red and green feathers, Worksheet, Observation grid



<b>Notes for the teacher:</b>	This activity has to be implemented only to pupils who have been taught already about bullying (definition, types, participants).
<b>Recommendations for additional activities:</b>	After the activity, pupils should be required to produce a set of rules and regulations to combat bullying.
